- **MSU Symphony Band: MUSM 371/671** (2019-present)
Live, face-to-face. Top large instrumental ensemble at MSU. Rehearses 200 minutes weekly and performs four to five times each academic year. Periodically tours. Selected to perform at the Kentucky Music Educators Association State Professional Development Conference, February 2022.
- **MSU Concert Band: MUSM 370/670** (2017-2020, 2022-present)
Live, face-to-face. The second band at MSU, consisting of music majors and non-music majors. Rehearses 150 minutes weekly in the fall and 200 minutes weekly in the spring. Performs three to four times each academic year. Taught by an adjunct instructor for three semesters (spring 2021 through spring 2022)
- **MSU Marching Band: MUSM 372/672** (2017-present)
Live, face-to-face. Over 100 members made up of music majors and non-music majors. Rehearses an average of 330 minutes weekly in the fall and performs 10-15 times each fall. Periodically tours, most recently at KMEA State Quarterfinals in 2021.
- **Instrumental Conducting: MUSC 472** (2020-present)
Live, face-to-face. Refines skills initially taught in our basic conducting course. Topics include conducting nuance and expression, non-verbal communication, error detection, rehearsal techniques. Texts used: Stotter, *Methods and Materials for Conducting*; Spradling, *Error Detection*.
- **Private Applied Conducting: MUSP 363** (2022-present)
Live, face-to-face. Refines and advances skills taught in our basic and instrumental conducting courses. Topics include nuance and expression, cueing technique, non-verbal communication.
- **Foundations of Music Education: MUSE 207** (2018-2019)
Live, face-to-face. Sophomore-level music education course. Introduces foundational concepts, principles, and history. Topics include history of music education, especially in the United States; developmental psychology and learning theory; philosophy of music education; special needs. Texts used: Hoffer, *Introduction to Music Education*; Hammel and Hourigan, *Teaching Music to Students with Special Needs*.
- **Instrumental Materials and Methods: MUSE 376** (2017-present)
Live, face-to-face. Senior-level music education course. Topics include materials and methods for instrumental instruction,

program administration and advocacy, program organization and structure, lesson planning, curriculum design, communication, special needs accommodations and modifications. Text used: Felman and Contzius, *Instrumental Music Education: Teaching with the Musical and Practical in Harmony*.

- **Psychology of Music: MUSE 625** (offered as needed)
Asynchronous, online. A study of the psychological processes upon which musical behavior depends. Topics include music origins and functions, perception, music response and cognition, musical development, musical skill acquisition, musical preference. Text used: Hallam, Cross, and Thaut (eds), *The Oxford Handbook of Music Psychology*; other course materials are instructor designed.
- **Seminar in Music Education: MUSE 682** (offered as needed)
Asynchronous, online. An intensive investigation into music education topics. With guidance, students select a topic for study. Topics include reinforcement of research fundamentals, constructing annotated bibliographies, conducting a literature review, and practical applications of research. Course materials are instructor designed.
- **Independent Study: MUSW 676** (offered as needed)
Asynchronous, online. Topics/Area of study are variable based on student interests/needs. Previous topics have included instrumental music history and improving intonation in instrumental ensembles. Course materials are instructor designed, but have included texts such as Hansen, *The American Wind Band: A Cultural History*.
- **Class Woodwinds II: MUSG 212** (2019)
Live, face-to-face. Woodwind pedagogy course. Taught in collaboration with private applied woodwind faculty. Topics focused on beginning band approaches to teaching and assessing woodwind playing fundamentals. Course materials were instructor designed.
- **Class Brasswinds II: MUSG 213** (2018)
Live, face-to-face. Brass pedagogy course. Taught in collaboration with private applied brass faculty. Topics focused on beginning band approaches to teaching and assessing brass playing fundamentals. Course materials were instructor designed.
